2019 was another busy, yet smooth, year at the Stirling-Rawdon Public Library.



We are thrilled to know that we are recognized as a vital cornerstone in the community! Circulation of library items and use of the public computers remained steady along with a consistent increase in the number of e-books and audio books borrowed through our membership with Overdrive. Although the Interlibrary Loan program was suspended for a short period earlier in the year due to provincial budget cuts that the Southern Ontario Library Association experienced, our generous patrons made it possible to continue offering the service after financial donations were received.

Programs were once again extremely successful throughout 2019. Haley organized a wide variety of events, activities, workshops, clubs, and active and passive programs for young and old.

Without any staff changes, issues with the library building or other unforeseen dilemmas or expenses, it was a positive and encouraging year.


2019 Programming















The Stirling Musical Instrument Lending Library opened its doors to the public in January 2019 and has continued to grow and evolve. Currently, the MILL has 60 patrons from all areas of Hastings County, bringing new people through our doors on a regular basis and over 200 instruments and instructional books for loan. After some changes at the Board level in June, the current Board was established and has been dilegently promoting the MILL through site visits and networking at libraries in our area, hosting fundraising events, and creating connections throughout the County. With a wonderful volunteer base, an active Board of Directors and one part-time employee, the MILL is firmly established and just one more resource the library is proud to offer.



The Stirling-Rawdon Public Library has been happy to continue partnering with the Community Development Council of Quinte in offering the monthly Good Food Box and Good Baby Box programs to the residents in our area. In 2019, there were 205 orders made through the library, providing families an opportunity to stretch their food dollar, reduce their food costs, purchase baby care items, and meet the nutritional needs of individuals and families.



For the second consecutive year, the library has had the opportunity to offer parking passes to our patrons provided by the Quinte Conservation Authority. Patrons of the Stirling Library are able to borrow a parking pass for a one week period to several of the beautiful conservation areas throughout Hastings and Prince Edward Counties at no cost.
