# Library Update

Since the proof of COVID-19 vaccination system took effect in Ontario, we've had many patrons inquire about whether or not they are required to present their vaccination certificate in order to enter the library.

## At this time, Ontario libraries are **NOT** one of the locations where proof of vaccination is required.

We **do** ask that you continue to remember to use the hand sanitizer in our front lobby upon entering the library or wash your hands in our washrooms upstairs. Please wear your mask at all times, even if you've been fully vaccinated and practice physical distancing from others. If you are unable to wear a mask, we are more than happy to provide curbside service...just give us a call and let us know how we can help.

As per the COVID-19 Vaccination Policy adopted by the Township of Stirling-Rawdon, all municipal staff will be required to provide proof of being fully vaccinated on or before December 15th, 2021 or provide proof of a negative COVID-19 rapid antigen test at a minimum of twice per week.

We sincerely appreciate everyone's patience and cooperation over the last 18 months and look forward to gradually getting back to the lively, active, community hub we've worked so hard to become!

### Five books. Five champions. One winner.




Each week a staff member will be defending their choice on social media.

Drop into the library and pick up a book today! Vote by November 30th





### Fred Leonard

Local author, Fred Leonard, Jr., has undergone years of research to write this passionate book about history - his family, his ancestors and his ancestral land, Tyendinaga Mohawk Territory. Discover with Fred, his physical and emotional travels as he searches for his family's roots.

Born in Belleville, Fred moved to Toronto at the age of 3 before returning to this area as a young adult. He has travelled across North America to meet elders and learn their traditional knowledge, spirituality and history. He is a social activist for Indigenous rights and environmental issues and has owned and operated his own business for the last nine years.
