Library Update

Over the past several months, our Library Board, along with library staff and the crew at Signarama have been working together to come up with a unique Stirling Library logo. We offer a great number of services and we play an important role in our community and we wanted a logo that represented us well.



The open book represents the obvious symbol when one thinks of a library...books. We of course lend out many different items; books, magazines, DVDs, park passes, audio books, audio book players and more. Items available to borrow change over time as well...new items are added to our collection while others are phased out. For this reason we felt that using something as timeless as a book would encompass all the different items that we lend to our patrons.

The book pages represent people; patrons, community members, program participants, partners, guests etc. We are a gathering place for people in our community to come together to learn, discover, socialize, and connect with one another. We are an inclusive space and serve patrons and members of the community of all ages, abilities, ethnicities and orientation which is symbolized by book pages-turned-people of varying colours and sizes.

The square blocks incorporated into our logo represent technology and the digital age. While books are always going to have a place on our shelves, more and more digital resources such as streaming services, e-books, audio books, social media, public access computers, IT assistance, online catalogues, and STEM activities are an everyday are part of our library lives.
